Viaduct update: Alaskan Way South closure; Viaduct transmission lines relocation; Parking during construction

Starting Jan.5 through 2013: SR 99 Tunnel Project crews will close Alaskan Way South between South Main and South King streets, and both directions of traffic underneath the viaduct will be rerouted. See the detour here. Crews will be relocating utilities and completing other tunnel related work.

Starting now through Spring 2012: Crews working for Seattle City Light have been working on viaduct transmission lines between Yesler Way and Union Street. The transmission lines will be relocated from the underside of the viaduct to underground locations nearby.

Pioneer Square and waterfront representatives are continuing to coordinate with WSDOT and the City of Seattle on strategies to compensate for parking losses due to construction. A complete list of upcoming traffic changes is located here.
