Family Housing Connection (FHC)2-1-1 or 800.621.4636

As of April 23, 2012, King County 2-1-1 began screening for Family Housing Connection. Family Housing Connection provides a single access point for families with children and pregnant women seeking shelter and transitional housing in King County.

Steps to get shelter or transitional housing through Family Housing Connection:

1. Call 2-1-1.
2. 2-1-1 will schedule an appointment for you to meet with an FHC specialist.
3. Meet with an FHC specialist at a site near you. FHC specialists are able to meet with clients at 8 different locations throughout King County.
4. Receive a follow-up phone call when a housing resource becomes available.
5. Meet with the housing staff at that location to ensure that it's the best fit for you and your family.

SINGLE ADULTS *referral required*

NOTE: When a referral is required for a transitional housing program, generally the program requires that a *case manager* call on behalf of the client. When contacting the agencies below, please have your case manager call on your behalf.

Elizabeth Gregory Home 206.729.0262
REFERRAL REQUIRED: Provides transitional housing and case management services for women, with average length of stay one year or more. Residents meet weekly with a case manager to set and achieve goals.

Salvation Army—William Booth Center 206.287.0105
REFERRAL REQUIRED: Provides housing for 48 clients on the second and third floors of the main building for up to 24 months. Case managers assist program participants in accessing community services. Maximum stay is 24 months.

Compass Housing Alliance - HomeStep.....206.357.3160
REFERRAL REQUIRED: Offers transitional housing, with case management, at approximately 100 scattered units and shared houses throughout King County. Case management services offer clients advocacy and support while pursuing goals in health, housing, education/vocational training and employment. Offers stays of up to 24 months. Certain properties are reserved for single adults.

* May serve offenders, on a case-by-case basis.

** May serve sex offenders, on a case-by-case basis.

YOUTH & YOUNG ADULTS

New Ground Avondale Park - Redmond

Serves individuals, couples and families with or without children. Ages 18-24.

New Ground Sand Point - Seattle

Serves women, ages 18-21, who are pregnant or parenting their first child.

New Ground - Bothell

Serves women, ages 18-21, who are pregnant or parenting their first child.

New Ground - Everett

Serves single, non-parenting men and women. Ages 18-21.

Goodwill - Teen Parent Home*206.322.8918

339 22nd Ave E, Seattle

Serves teen mothers, ages 13-18, and their children. Each mother may have one child, and may be pregnant. Residents must attend school, including GED and vocational programs. Homelessness not required.

Kent Youth & Family - Watson Manor*253.859.0300

Serves single mothers and pregnant women, ages 16-25. May not have more than two children. If pregnant, must be in 3rd trimester. Must be in school or working at least 20 hours per week. Rent is 30% of income.

Serves young adults, ages 18-23.

YMCA - Transitions Supportive Housing* 206.749.7550

Single, non parenting/pregnant, men and women. Ages 18-23.

YouthCare - Home of Hope* 206.694.4500

6622 62nd Ave NE, Seattle

Serves young adults, ages 18-24. Referral from another transitional housing program required. Maintains waitlist. 30% of income; minimum fee is \$100, maximum is \$290.

YouthCare - Isis206.522.8412

6622 62nd Ave NE, Seattle

Serves youth, ages 18-21 in a house in N. Seattle. Emphasizes serving LGBTQ. No referral required for initial inquiry.

YouthCare - Passages..... 206.985.8343

Serves youth, ages 18-21 in a community living house in North Seattle. No referral required for initial inquiry.

Auburn Youth Resources - Severson House..... 253.804.8866

Operates transitional housing for homeless young adults, ages 18 through 24; clients can stay for up to two years.

Transitional housing programs generally allow stays between 90 days and 24 months, usually as an extended mid-point between emergency shelter and permanent housing. Transitional housing programs entail case management and/or other supportive services designed to help clients address the causes of their homelessness and gain the stability necessary to obtain permanent housing. Like shelters, transitional housing programs are offered in a range of environments, from facility-based peer-group settings to scattered individual apartments or single-family homes. Most transitional housing programs require clients pay 30% of their monthly income for rent in order to facilitate readiness for permanent housing.

Sojourner Place* 206.545.4200
Serves single women without children and pregnant women. Pregnant women may stay 3 months after giving birth. Must be 3 months clean and sober, if in recovery. Must be working, in job training, or volunteering. Rent is \$290/month for a shared room, \$365 for a private room. Rent includes room, food, utilities, phone/internet access, laundry.

Seattle Indian Center - See'sha Inn..... 206.329.8700
611 12th Ave S, Seattle
WALK IN for intake. Daily, 6:30-10:30pm. Serves men only.\$15/night, cash only. Sober clients only, provides breakfast and shower in the morning.

United States Mission* 206.781.9113
Serves men, ages 18+. Must be willing and able to work. Self-help work program is required of all residents; work is paid so clients can establish a savings. Agency does not proselytize; no religious components are required. Provides 2 meals a day. No fees.

Interaction Transition..... 206.324.1244
Serves single women, age 21+. Houses are in Capitol Hill neighborhood. Must be 6 months clean and sober. Residents must either be working, volunteering, or in school with a steady source of income. Rent is 30% of income. Referral not required but professional and housing references are required.

Serves single women, age 21+. Houses are in Capitol Hill neighborhood. Must be 6 months clean and sober. Residents must either be working, volunteering, or in school with a steady source of income. Rent is 30% of income. Referral not required but professional and housing references are required.

Aloha Inn*..... 206.283.6070
Serves adults, ages 18+, without children. Apply in person at the Client Service Office located at 116 Stewart St, Seattle. Applications are accepted W, 10am-noon, and Th, 5-7pm. Applicants must have income.

Compass Housing Alliance
This agency maintains multiple sites and programs. Each program has its own intake procedure and waitlist, if applicable.

Compass Cascade* ** 206.357.3150
Serves single women with income less than 30% of area median. Rent is 30% of income; no one will be refused for inability to pay.

Long Term Transitional Housing* ** 206.357.3266
Serves single men and women. Rent is 30% of income plus a fee for misc. items. Refundable deposit required. Houses are located in North Seattle. Must be willing to make six month commitment.

Pioneer Square* ** 206.357.3250
Screens on Tu and F, 1pm. Sobriety required. Serves men, ages 18+ with annual income below 30% of area median. Rent is 30% of income, plus misc. fees. No one is refused for inability to pay.

Veterans Transitional Housing - Shoreline* 206.357.3280
Serves male and female veterans of U.S. military who completed term of service with a better than dishonorable discharge. Private rooms, shared bathrooms and common areas. Income must be less than 30% of area median. Rent is 30% of income, plus \$50

Vietnam Veterans Leadership Program*..... 206.357.3263
Housing is located in two large single-family style houses, one in Seattle's Columbia City, and one in Burien. Must be willing and able to work. Serves male veterans with a better than dishonorable discharge. Rent is 30% of income plus \$10 for misc. items. \$50 refundable deposit.

Jubilee Women's Center* 206.324.1244
Serves single women, age 21+. Houses are in Capitol Hill neighborhood. Must be 6 months clean and sober. Residents must either be working, volunteering, or in school with a steady source of income. Rent is 30% of income. Referral not required but professional and housing references are required.

Share/Wheel* 206.448.7889
1902 2nd Ave, Seattle
Operates three self-managed transitional housing sites in South Seattle, for men and women experiencing homelessness. Houses a total of 20 people at a time, with stays up to two years in length. Attend a weekly SHARE Power Lunch meeting, to be screened. Meetings are held Saturdays at noon, in a different location weekly. For upcoming meeting location, call or check posting on SHARE office door any time after 4pm on Thursday.

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RECOVERY HOUSING

Clean & sober housing for single women, ages 18+. Must be clean for 30 days prior to entry. Priority given to women involved in the criminal justice system. May accept pregnant women, usually in 1st/2nd trimester. Rent is 30% of income.

Serves women 18+. Must be 30 days clean & sober and enrolled in outpatient treatment program. May accept pregnant women; usually in 1st/2nd trimester. Rent is 30% of income.

Pioneer Human Services* ** 206.766.7940
Provides furnished units of clean and sober SRO transitional housing for clients recovering from substance abuse for up to two years.

2317 3rd Ave, Seattle
Call: Tu-Th, 4-5pm. Serves single men w/o children. Must be able to verify at least 45 days clean & sober. Rent is 30% of income.

Union Gospel Mission

New Creations* 206.622.5177
NOT a state-certified chemical dependency program. Does not require time clean & sober when entering program, but must have a desire to be drug/alcohol free. Participation in 12-step program is required. Focus on relapse prevention, ending self-destructive behaviors, and growth in faith. Serves men, 18+.
New Vision* - 1808 18th Ave, Seattle 206.322.6801
Comprehensive residential treatment for chemical dependency. 1-year program. Includes counseling, life skills training, relapse prevention. Enrollment in 12-step program required. Program is Christian-based, but no religious belief is required. Located in Capitol Hill. Serves men, ages 18+.
Riverton Place* - 3020 S 128th St, Seattle 206.242.5585
WA State certified Chemical Dependency Program. Nine month program. Required participation in work therapy and Bible study. Serves men, ages 18+.
The Oaks* - 3802 Othello, Seattle 206.628.2008
12 month rehabilitation program for chemically dependant women. Call to apply between 8:30 and 9am.

Victory Outreach Church*

Christian-based home. Serves single and married adults who have a desire to change their lifestyle. 9-12 months commitment is required. Sliding scale fees: \$0-\$250.

Serves men, ages 19-45. Highly structured transitional recovery program. Residents must have a strong desire to change harmful behaviors. No fees.
