## Alaskan Way Viaduct Closed For Approximately Two Weeks Beginning April 29

The Alaskan Way Viaduct will close for approximately two weeks starting Friday, April 29 to allow Bertha, the SR 99 tunneling machine, to tunnel beneath the viaduct near Yesler Way. WSDOT recognizes that closing a major highway will be disruptive to local and regional traffic, and is working with other agencies to keep people moving during the closure.
