Planning for January Construction Impacts & Beyond

After over 11 years of planning and work, it's here. The closure of the Alaskan Way Viaduct is quickly approaching. With this milestone, Pioneer Square is a step closer to reconnecting with the waterfront for the first time since 1949. This period will no doubt be challenging and will require your continued resilience and creativity. Below is a timeline of major downtown projects that will impact traffic beginning in January and over the next few years, along with some tips for preparation and contact information.



Timeline

January 4, 2019 | SR 99 Stadium Ramps Close: Northbound

SR 99 on-ramp from Royal Brougham Way and Southbound SR 99 off-ramp to S Atlantic Street close about one week before the full closure to allow for work on connections to the new SR 99 tunnel.

January 11, 2019 | Alaskan Way Viaduct Closes: WSDOT will close SR 99 through downtown Seattle for approximately three weeks to build roadway and ramp connections, realign SR 99 and open the new SR 99 tunnel.

Early February 2019 | <u>SR 99 Tunnel Opens</u>: The new 2-mile stretch of SR 99 tunnel opens to traffic. After the tunnel opens the northbound off-ramp to downtown will remain closed for up to two weeks.

Early 2019 - 2020 | Alaskan Way Viaduct Removal and Related Projects: After the tunnel opens, AWV demolition begins by the waterfront, the Battery Street Tunnel will be decommissioned, and surface streets around Aurora Ave N will be reconnected.

March 2019 | <u>Bus Service Ends in the Light Rail Tunnel</u>: King County Metro bus routes 41, 74, 101, 102, 150, 255 and Sound Transit Express Route 550 buses will no longer use the transit tunnel and will operate on surface streets, including a new transit pathway on 5th and 6th Avenues.

2019 - 2021 | Waterfront Construction: Built by the City of Seattle's Office of the Waterfront, the new Alaskan Way street will be transformed along the waterfront with a new promenade and connections to the Pike Place Market.

2019 | <u>SR 99 Tunnel Tolling</u>: The SR 99 tunnel will be free to use when it opens for a period before tolling starts. Tolling could begin as early as summer 2019.

Under construction thru 2022 | <u>WA State Convention Center (WSCC) Addition:</u> WSCC has launched a transformative project that will provide economic and public benefits, including affordable housing, cycling, and pedestrian improvements, and a study of lidding more of I-5 – as part of its \$92 million expansion. Construction is expected to be complete in Q3 2021, with the addition open to the public in Q1 2022.

Bus Changes



With all of the information around the closure of the viaduct, we wanted to highlight one impact you need to be aware of. King County Metro will detour a dozen SR99 routes serving about 30,000 riders. During the viaduct closure the routes will use a 4^{th} Ave route that includes a southbound couplet on 2^{nd} Ave Ext. After 4-5 weeks, the detour will move over to an interim pathway for 9 months -1 year that utilizes 1^{st} Ave S both north and southbound.

Center City Connector Streetcar

No update as of 1/3/2019

On March 30, Mayor Durkan directed the City of Seattle to halt the ongoing projects related to the <u>Center City Connector</u> streetcar, except for work on seismically vulnerable water mains in Pioneer Square.

The initial summary of findings was released on August 31 with further information on capital and operating costs.

Alaskan Way Viaduct Replacement Program

The big Realign99 highway closure is nearly upon us! This Friday, Jan. 4, the two SR 99 ramps near the stadiums close at 10 p.m. Closing the northbound on-ramp at Royal Brougham Way and the southbound off-ramp at South Atlantic Street gives crews time and space to begin working on the ramps connecting to the new tunnel.

The <u>full closure of the Alaskan Way</u>
<u>Viaduct</u> and SR 99 begins at 10 p.m. Friday,
Jan. 11. This closure will extend from South
Spokane Street to Western Avenue. The first
weekend of the full closure, crews will remove
a small section of the northbound ramp to the
viaduct alongside Railroad Way South. As a
result, Railroad Way South will be closed that
weekend, as well as one lane of First Avenue
South.
