

WA STATE- PHASE 3

- On May 13, Governor Jay Inslee <u>announced</u> that the entirety of Washington State may progress into Phase 3 of the <u>Healthy Washington</u> plan beginning May 17.
- Inslee also announced a target date of June 30 to fully reopen the state, pending an variation in COVID-19 data.
- The following guidance is now in place for Phase 3:

Activity/Space	Phase 3
Indoor spaces (restaurants, retail stores, fitness centers)	Maximum 50% capacity, or 400 people maximum
Outdoor spaces (dining, etc.)	Table size for indoor and outdoor dining is limited to a maximum of 10 people.
Sporting events	Maximum 25% capacity or 9,000



CDC / KING COUNTY MASK GUIDANCE

- Last week, the CDC <u>announced</u> fully vaccinated people can resume activities without wearing a mask or physically distancing, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance.
- Governor Inslee announced that individual business owners may choose to require all customers to wear masks.
- Seattle / King County Public Health <u>announced</u> that mask wearing is required in public indoor spaces unless they have implemented a state-approved means of checking everyone's vaccination status upon entry
- On May 21, Governor Inslee released a <u>proclamation</u> further clarifying mask guidance.





OCCIDENTAL SQUARE PAVILION

- The <u>Occidental Square Pavilion</u> will open to the public on June 11.
- The fencing on the playspace will also be removed.
- The Downtown Seattle Association will begin activating the pavilion and surrounding park with activities, programming, art installations and staffing on a daily basis.
- The Pavillion is a collaboration between the Seattle Parks Foundation, the Alliance for Pioneer Square, Downtown Seattle Association, and Seattle Parks and Recreation.





2021 CRUISE SEASON

- On Thursday, May 20th several cruise lines said they will restart roundtrip cruises from Seattle to Alaska this summer.
- The resumption of sailing is made possible by the recent passage of the Alaska Tourism Restoration Act, which will allow cruise lines to bypass Canada.
- Princess Cruises, Holland America Line and Carnival Cruise Line said they would restart cruising to Alaska.
- All three cruise lines signaled a sail start date of late July through mid September.

SOUNDERS + MARINERS GAME SCHEDULES

- Both the <u>Seattle Sounders</u> and <u>Mariners</u> seasons have begun.
- Some home games will overlap with the Lumen Field Mass Vaccination site.
- Game-day attendance is expected to increase as Washington State progresses toward the June 30th target date to fully reopen.
- Seattle Police are responsible for directing traffic during game days.

CONSTRUCTION IMPACTS

- I-5 southbound restoration work between I-90 and Spokane Street is scheduled to start Monday, May 24.
 Nighttime and weekend lane closures will be needed. Construction is expected to last until fall 2022.
- Construction will begin on the <u>Metropole</u>
 <u>Building</u> (423 2nd Ave Ext. S) very soon.
 - Construction is expected to last through August 2022.
 - The building will house nonprofits on the upper levels as well as a childcare center.





CITY EXTENDS FREE OUTDOOR DINING PERMITS

- Seattle City Council on Monday waived sidewalk- and curb-space permit fees through May 31, 2022.
- The free permits, first approved last summer, were set to expire later this year.
- Permits are available via SDOT's <u>Public</u>
 <u>Space Management Team</u>.

 In late May/early June, two new pieces of public art will be installed in Occidental Square Park. The first is a revival piece by Dylan Neuwirth's called "Just Be Your Selfie." The second piece is also a revival by Celeste Cooning.







2021 BIA INSPIRATION FUND


- The BIA is matching volunteer hours and/or funding up to \$5,000 for community members to implement projects and programs making a positive impact in the Pioneer Square neighborhood as part of the <u>Inspiration</u> Fund.
- The BIA will accept applications for projects ranging from \$1,000-\$5,000. 80% will be funded when the grant is awarded. Remaining 20% funded upon completion.
- Applications are due May 31.
- Award notifications will be sent on July 15.

PUBLIC SAFETY

- De-escalation training series:
 - The Alliance has partnered with MID, and SPD to hold a series of de-escalation trainings in 2021. This series is a continuation of the trainings held in 2020.
 - The de-escalation training we'll be providing is going to be an in-depth training program that teaches how to recognize, reduce, and manage aggressive behavior.

- Crime and safety survey:
 - Earlier this month, we invited neighborhood business owners to complete a <u>brief survey</u> regarding their crime and safety experiences over the past 12 months.
 - Survey closes May 29.
