Leadership, Capacity Building, and Advocacy

- Advocated for zoning changes to support housing development for a maker's district.
- Submitted an application to the Washington State Arts Commission for the designation of Pioneer Square as a Creative District.

Public Realm

- Led and supported multiple community engagement efforts for projects, including Pioneer Square Park, City Hall Park and Prefontaine Place, and Occidental Promenade.
- Submitted a grant application to King County's Healthy Communities and Parks fund to further design capital improvements to Pioneer Square Park.

Business Development

- Hired a Sports Economy Coordinator to leverage the opportunities of Club World Cup in 2025 and World Cup in 2026.
- Hosted a webinar to help businesses prepare for the 2025 Club World Cup, summer concerts, and other neighborhood events.
- Organized a tour for local hotel concierges to highlight the shops, galleries, and restaurants that their guests can enjoy.

Communications & Marketing

- Provided interviews to represent the Pioneer Square community to the Seattle Times, the Puget Sound Business Journal, KUOW-FM, KNKX-FM, all four local TV stations, and the weekly business podcast.
- Supported the Seattle Jazz Fellowship's first Pioneer Square Jazz Night, featuring 13 bands at 13 locations throughout the neighborhood.
